Linda Fogg – Leadership McKinney Book Collection

Linda is a chemical engineer and worked for 20 years at Procter & Gamble as a plant manufacturing manager. She had assignments in the US, London, Bangkok and Malaysia. After her husband, Don, retired from P&G, they moved to northern New England, where Linda became involved as a volunteer in the schools and the community raising money for educational organizations and civic groups. She was the director of the Main Street Program in St. Johnsbury, Vermont and established a Chamber of Commerce for the town. Linda was awarded Best Main Street Program Director by the state of Vermont in 2008 for her leadership, competing with 38 Main Street program directors in Vermont. She established a financially secure non-profit during her time as director by creating a membership organization, successful fundraising and grant writing. She was appointed to the Vermont Commission for Women by Governor Jim Douglas in 2008 and provided input to legislative issues affecting women and children in Vermont.

After their daughter graduated from high school in June 2010, Linda and her husband moved back to her native Texas. Since returning to Texas, Linda has joined The Rotary Club of McKinney, First United Methodist Church of McKinney, is on the board of Communities in Schools, Dallas Region, is an Ambassador for McKinney Chamber of Commerce and is a member of the 2011 Leadership McKinney Class.

Linda graduated from the University of Texas with a BA in biology and from the University of Houston with a BS in chemical engineering.

The Leadership McKinney Class of 2011 will be collecting books for children in MISD that currently have no books in their homes. Approximately 15% of children in MISD have no books or reading materials in their homes. Our goal is to collect 2,011 books in 2011 and distribute to children in pre-K through fifth grade. Melissa Rotary Kids Our Kids Program Will Serve Special Needs Children and Their Families. Free Respite Care; Volunteers and Program Participants Still Needed

The Melissa Rotary will open the doors to the Kids Our Kids Respite Program on March 26, 2011 at 6 p.m. at Mudpies and Lullabies Preschool in Melissa. This respite care program for families with special needs children is the latest project that the Melissa Rotary is taking on in the North Collin county area.

The Kids Our Kids Family Respite program will serve area families and their children through respite care. It is the culmination of three service organizations coming together to provide a meaningful impact in their community. The Melissa Rotary reached out to the Unbiological Sisterhood group and Omega Delta Phi service fraternity to help identify volunteers.

Respite programming is short-term, temporary relief for those who are caring for family members that require special attention. It gives short term breaks to these caregivers and is a much needed break from the exhausting challenges faced by family caregivers.

"We've been in this position of needing respite service in the past," says Danielle Dorman-Chapa, a Melissa Rotary member and mother of a special needs child. "You just can't call anyone to come in and watch your child with special needs." Families with special needs children have divorce rates of between 85 to 90 percent.

"Having a special needs child presents challenges for everyone in a family," Dorman-Chapa said. "Respite is a necessary and needed break to let mom, dad and siblings catch their breath."

"When we were approached to be a partner for this program it only made common sense," said Jesse Tapia, Chairman of the Omega Delta Phi, DFW Alumni Service Fraternity. "It is a pure volunteer effort that only requires compassion for others and our time; that's what our organization is all about."

"We are excited to be one of the founding groups that can bring this important project into existence," Tapia said. "We understand that there are year plus long waiting lists for programs just like this one." "Families shouldn't have to wait to be able to make time for each other and we are excited to help."

The Kids Our Kids program will take place quarterly and is open to any families that have a special needs child from ages 6 months to 12 years. All of the siblings of the special needs family will also be able to attend free of charge.

“What makes this program unique is that it puts one volunteer with one child,” Dorman-Chapa said. “Every child that is part of Kids Our Kids will have one volunteer dote on them the entire time they are with us.”

The service is provided free of charge to all participants but pre-registration is required. The Rotary is still looking for volunteers but most importantly still has openings for families that can use this service.
