Sy Shahid – Executive Director Heard Museum

Sy is a long term resident of McKinney and owner/operator of multiple retail operations. He has been involved as a volunteer, board member, and board president of several non-profit organizations in the last 20 years. Sy is committed to the Heard mission of bringing people and nature together.

Sy is married to Julia who is a professor of education at Austin College in Sherman. Their daughter Shanna Garza, M.D., is completing her medical residency this June at John Petersmith Hospital in Fort Worth.

The Heard Natural Science Museum & Wildlife Sanctuary, in McKinney, Texas, is the result of one woman's vision for the future and her commitment to the community and North Texas. Miss Bessie Heard devoted most of her lifetime (1886-1988) to the city of McKinney and its people. Her philanthropic endeavors and generosity of spirit left a legacy of accomplishment few people attain.

Her greatest contribution to her community and North Texas is the Heard Natural Science Museum & Wildlife Sanctuary. Miss Heard was 80 years old when she saw the need to preserve a place where future generations could visit to experience nature. The museum opened October 1, 1967 and now serves more than 100,000 visitors annually.

In keeping with Miss Heard's vision, the museum's mission is threefold: education, conservation and preservation. Through education, particularly for young people, the Heard emphasizes an appreciation of nature and its conservation.

Rotary Praises U.S. Leaders for Effort to End Polio

Nine Rotarian couples were recently inducted into the Arch C. Klumph Society, which honors people who give at least US\$250,000 to The Rotary Foundation.

Four couples, District Governor Roberto Luiz Barroso Filho and his wife, Eliane; Past District Governors Dennis and Kathy Crawford; Don Blackburn and his wife, LaVonne; and Carlos E. Sandoval Delgado and his wife, Martha, were honored the third week of April during ceremonies at RI World Headquarters in Evanston, Illinois, USA, where their portraits now hang in the Arch C. Klumph Gallery.

Barroso

Roberto Luiz Barroso Filho, a technical engineer and real estate agent, joined the Rotary Club of Santos, São Paulo, Brazil, in 1995. He is governor of District 4420 and was president of his club in 2005-06.

Founder of Engelpus Construction Incorporated Ltd., Barroso has implemented more than 30 projects to build hospitals, universities, and other facilities. He is a finance board member of the Association of Construction Entrepreneurs of Baixada Santista. He also served on the board of Casa da Esperança, which assists people affected by mental or physical illnesses. Barroso and his wife support the Foundation's [Annual Programs Fund](#) and the [Permanent Fund](#). The couple's son and daughter are Rotary Youth Exchange alumni and former Interact club members.

Crawford

Dennis and Kathy Crawford are members of the Rotary Club of McCandless, Pennsylvania, USA, and have both served as governor of District 7300.

Dennis is co-owner and president of All-Pak Inc., an international container distribution company. He is also involved with the National Association of Container Distributors, the National Association of Wholesalers, and the International Organization of Packaging Professionals.

Kathy retired in 1999 as owner of Kathy's Closet, a women's apparel store she founded in 1975. She is a member of the Pittsburgh Fashion Association. She has also served on the ways and means committee of the Northern Area Chamber of Commerce.

The couple took part in National Immunization Days in Niger and Nigeria. Kathy says the experience gave her a clearer understanding of why it's important to support the Foundation. "Rotary is the greatest volunteer organization in the world," she says. "We have the international networking ability to meet the needs out there."

Blackburn

Don Blackburn joined Rotary in 1970 and is now a member of the Rotary Club of Ponte Vedra Beach, Florida, USA, where his wife is an honorary member. He retired in 1998 as CEO and chair of the American Foodservice Corporation, which he founded in King of Prussia, Pennsylvania.

"The Foundation is doing so much good for the health and well being of all people," says Blackburn. "It does fundraising the right way, the best way, because it's done within the organization. Each Rotarian is a fundraiser."

Blackburn and his wife donate to PolioPlus to support Rotary's effort to eradicate polio. He has been involved with the fight against the disease since the 1950s, when he served as county chair of the March of Dimes in Sioux Falls, South Dakota.

The Blackburns are also major contributors to the Mayo Clinic. They support the Foundation's [Annual Programs Fund](#) and the [Permanent Fund](#).

Sandoval

Carlos E. Sandoval Delgado is the chair and manager of the ORSAN Group, a gasoline enterprise with service stations throughout Mexico. He joined Rotary in 1975 and has served as governor of District 4130 and president of the Rotary Club of San Nicolás de los Garza, Nuevo León.

He also founded and serves on the board of Integral Health Development A.C., which raises funds for the Dr. José Eleuterio González University Hospital. In addition, he serves on the boards of the Monterrey branch of the Mexican Red Cross and the Autonomous University of Nuevo León.

The Sandovals have four children and nine grandchildren. Their family formed the ORSAN Foundation, which supports health initiatives.

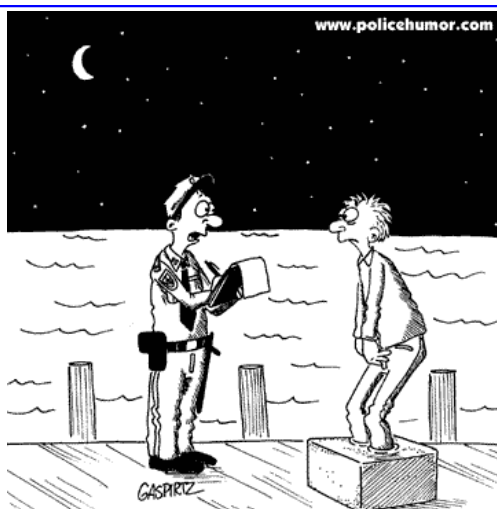
